We are a Church on a journey...

A journey with a mission...

As we travel on our 'DISCOVER, NURTURE, SHARE' journey, we strive to be:

an inclusive, community-focussed church that seeks to help people from all backgrounds to encounter God in both traditional and contemporary ways, and to be a safe place to explore faith, ask questions, and grow as a follower of Jesus.'

We have a vision for the next stage of the journey...

By 2025, we want to see:

• flourishing in the numbers of new people DISCOVERING God

with an **aim** of least 25 new people of all ages regularly attending our services (across the week), and an average Sunday morning congregation of at least 60 people.

• flourishing in people's NURTURING of their spiritual growth

with an **aim** of at least half of regular church members and growing numbers of explorers engaging in small 'spiritual growth' groups.

• Flourishing in people's SHARING of their faith through active discipleship

with an **aim** of all members of the church community using their individual skills and experiences to play a part in serving the church and local community.

During 2024/25 we're journeying towards this vision on 3 Priority Pathways

- Creating even more inclusive and engaging worship.
- Building a route to friendship, faith and discipleship for young people.
- Establishing and resourcing small groups

Our journey is underpinned by following values:

- Spirituality
- Inclusiveness
- Compassion
- Courage
- Generosity



To help us begin to make progress on our journey, we're focussing on some key steps during 2024

Pathway 1

Creating even more inclusive and engaging worship

Step 1 – Sacred Dimension Step 1 – Scoping

- Offer refresher training for intercessors, readers, servers and sides people.
- Undertake a 'music at St Michael's project' - build on our strong music tradition and consider different ways in which existing and new music could help people from all backgrounds connect with God.
- Experiment with different styles of services outside of Sunday am.

Step 2 – Invitation, gathering and welcome

- Build on our reputation as a 'welcoming church' – use the expertise of existing welcomers and coffee team, to grow a larger 'hospitality' team that collectively considers how to grow our culture of warm, generous hospitality before, during and after services (including outside of Sundays).
- Encourage people to sit with others, especially newcomers.
- Reinstate a pastoral care team (led by an Anna Chaplain), to notice when people are absent from worship and may need extra help, and to offer worship in care homes.
- Revise invitation lists, and tailor invites to appropriate services.
- Review the presentation of our worship on the website.

Pathway 2

Establishing and resourcing small groups

Clarify the purpose of small groups at St Michael's, and identify how new and existing groups could best help fulfil this purpose.

Pathway 3

Building a route to friendship, faith and discipleship for young people (11-16)

Step 1 – Worship

See path 1, plus... Involve more young people in worship roles on a Sunday morning.

Step 2 – Leadership

- Identify lay and ordained leaders for different groups.
- Provide resources to lay and ordained group leaders.

Step 2 – Belonging

- Establish a 'youth-led' youth group, with a focus on friendship and invitation, as well as faith and discipleship.
- Ensure young leaders are offered the training and mentoring they need to grow in their role.



Step 3 – Building

- Ensure accessibility is as good as it can be (physical, sound etc) and consider appropriate ways to bring the action closer to the congregation.
- Ensure buildings are kept clean, tidy, and well maintained.
- Undertake a vision exercise to consider how an 'ideal building' could help facilitate inclusive engaging worship.

Step 3 – Advent and Lent groups

- Continue to hold annual Advent and Lent groups on a wide variety of topics.
- Use these groups as 'invitational' opportunities – e.g. encourage regular attendees to invite a friend.
- Use these groups as a feeder for other small groups.

Step 4 – God-stuff in the pub

Monthly gathering in Hopfields pub (building on existing informal weekly group)

Step 5 – Explorer groups

Hold annual explorer course for adults and/or young people.

Step 3 – Discipleship

- Ensure space is given for thinking about discipleship within the new youth group.
- Undertake an audit of young people's existing and desired skills to help them identify new ways to serve the church and community.
- Offer periodic opportunities for young people to live out their faith outside of Sunday mornings – e.g. voluntary work, gardening, cleaning.

Step 4 – Communication

Ensure our communications channels are designed to effectively reaching young people (website, social media etc).

Longer Term...

- Periodically create worship opportunities outside of Sunday mornings that are particularly relevant to young people.
- Hold a youth-focussed social 'event' or weekend away.
